

Financial Aid Elements





Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

- All students receiving financial aid must maintain SAP
 - 2.0 GPA
 - 67% Completion Rate (avoid excessive withdrawing or "F" grades)
- If not maintained, student's financial aid eligibility may be placed on probation or suspended
- May have to appeal to have eligibility reinstated



Who can get federal student aid?

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident/eligible non-citizen
- High school graduate/GED holder
- Valid Social Security number (if applicable)
- If required, individuals registered for Selective Service
- Eligible degree/certificate program









- EFC Expected Family Contribution determines your funding eligibility based on the information reported on the FAFSA application
- COA Cost Of Attendance is made up of tuition, fees, room and board, transportation, etc.

COA - EFC = financial need



How do I apply for federal aid?


- Fill out your FAFSA at fafsa.gov (studentaid.gov)
 - Apply on or after October 1 but as early as possible to meet all deadlines.
 - School deadlines are listed on schools' websites.
 - Don't forget: watch for the confirmation page that says your FAFSA has been submitted,



What types of federal student aid could you be awarded?

- Federal Pell Grant
- Federal SEOG (depends on school availability)
- Federal Work-Study (depends on school availability)
- Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans
- Direct PLUS Loan (for parents): COA minus other aid received (more common at 4-year institutions)





What kind of State aid is available?

- Need-based Programs
 - Grants (example: Education Assistance Grant)
 - Part-time Grants (attending less than full-time)
 - MD Community College Promise Scholarship
- Legislative Programs
 - Senatorial & Delegate Scholarships

Maryland Promise Scholarship

- "Last dollar" scholarship, after all other non-loan aid is applied to the bill
- Maximum annual award: \$5,000 per recipient or actual tuition and fee charges, whichever is less
- Loan Conversion: Award will convert to a loan payable to the State if:
 - 1. student fails to receive a certificate or associate's degree or
 - 2. student fails to complete 45 credits prior to transferring to a four year institution
- If awarded, students must:
 - Enroll in at least 12 credits per semester or next non-credit class sequence.
 - Maintain a 2.5 GPA



What if I am not eligible for federal aid?

Complete the state's alternate application MSFAA.

Priority deadline is March 1st each year

Students may be eligible for the following MD State Aid programs:

- Maryland Promise Scholarship, Educational Opportunity Grant and Guaranteed Access Grant.
- State deadlines are at mhec.state.md.us





How to apply for Scholarships?

- Institutional vs Private
- Contact your college financial aid office for information regarding aid and scholarships.
- Scholarship search at <u>StudentAid.gov/scholarships</u>
- Rule of thumb: Do not pay to apply for scholarships
